





# INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM The Political Economy of Latin American Regionalism

Latin American regionalism is facing a period of transformation in the past few years. A changing global and regional context has led to a evolution of relatively old regional initiatives, such as the Southern Common Market (Mercosul/Mercosur) and the Central American Integration System (SICA), to a creation of new schemes such as the Bolivarian Alliance for the Peoples of America (ALBA), the Union of South American Nations (UNASUR), the Pacific Alliance and the Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC). These regional initiatives promote goals in diverse areas, such as trade, promotion of investment, infrastructure, financial and international cooperation, productive integration and social policy.

Regionalism and regional integration is perceived by political and economic circles in Latin America as a mechanism to deal with the changing international context. During this symposium famous academics and ambassadors from Latin American countries will treat the new aspects of Latin American regionalism. On the one hand, world-class scholars from Japan, Europe and Latin America will deal with the interactions between the new global context and the new stage of Latin American regionalism. Similarly, comparisons between the Asian and Latin American experiences on regional integration and international cooperation will be presented. On the other hand, ambassadors from some Latin American countries will talk about the present and future of regional integration in Latin America.
